Signallers receive HERRICK Medals



The winter sun was sitting low in the sky on 22nd November as 304 soldiers from 3rd (United Kingdom) Division Signal Regiment marched proudly off the Picton Barracks parade square after receiving their operational medals from the Master of Signals, Lt Gen Robert Baxter.

"Your performance on the tour has continued to polish the reputation of the Corps", said Lt Gen Baxter as he welcomed the troops home.

The summer of 2013 was technically challenging for the officers and soldiers of 3 DSR :

In Camp Bastion, they provided the communications for a new headquarters for Task Force Helmand against some very tight timelines, a move which was seen as the biggest and most complex move of a British military headquarters since the Second World War.

To the North in Kabul, personnel from the Regiment assisted with the installation of communications equipment into the Afghan National Army Officer Academy, enabling the first courses to start in the autumn. The Academy is seen as the UK's legacy in Afghanistan and the importance of the project was not lost on the Regiment.

"I am immensely proud of everything they have done", said their Commanding Officer, Lt Col Paul Griffiths. "They were magnificent on parade and they should feel rightly proud of what they have achieved over the last six months."

Despite the freezing temperature, there was standing room only at the parade for families and friends to watch the medals being presented, with music provided by The Band of the Royal Corps of Signals.

The Duchess also paid a short visit to 10 Army Education Centre in Tidworth where she had the opportunity to meet staff and gain an up to date understanding of ETS activity both on operations and in the UK.

2RTR celebrates Cambrai Day

"Tomorrow, the Tank Corps will have the chance for which they have been waiting for many months: to operate on good going in the van of the battle ..."



With these words, Maj Gen Hugh Elles, the Tank Corps Commander, began his address to his troops on the eve of the Battle of Cambrai in 1917. It was the first time that tank formations had been used on the Western Front. Within twelve months, the First World War was over.

2nd Royal Tank Regiment celebrated Cambrai Day on 20th November, with a Drumhead Service held on their parade square in Tidworth.

1RTR and 2RTR will merge in August 2014, to form The Royal Tank Regiment, which will be based in Tidworth and will be one of three Challenger 2 Regiments in the British Army.

The winner of the 10K race, with a time of 36.57 minutes, was WO2 QMSI Gaz Till, an Army Physical Training Instructor from Headley Court who recently served with 2RTR in Tidworth.

215 Signal Squadron Parade

Soldiers from 1 Mechanized Brigade's Signal Squadron (215) were presented with their Afghanistan medals at a parade held on 15th November. The medals were presented by the Master of Signals, Lt Gen Robert Baxter, who said :

"We had soldiers deployed all over Afghanistan and often needed to move equipment", said Major Liz Byfield, Officer Commanding the Squadron. "What my soldiers have achieved has made me immensely proud, I feel that I am well blessed having such fantastic men and women to work with."

Open for Business ...



The new Tidworth Garrison Theatre, the final major project to be completed as part of the redevelopment of the Tidworth and Bulford Garrison, was formally opened with a fanfare of trumpets on 1st November, by HM Lord Lieutenant of Wiltshire, Mrs Sarah Rose Troughton.

The main part of the new building is the theatre which comprises a main entrance, a lobby reception area and the new Pickernell Auditorium which can accommodate up to 700 people. There are also five conference/meeting rooms which can each hold fourteen people, or four of them can be joined to create one larger room for up to 56 people, with varying layouts. The building has state-of-the-art IT equipment, surround sound and an enormous 36' x 19' screen.

The other part of the building, with a separate entrance and reception, is an office complex which will be used primarily by the Army Welfare Service.

The new Theatre will be managed on behalf of the MOD by Aspire Defence Ltd and is available for use by both the military and civilian communities. Some of the Tidworth memorabilia collected by the Pickernell family over the years will be displayed in the upstairs foyer, where visitors to the new theatre will be able to see it.

19 Regt RA Cycle Challenge
