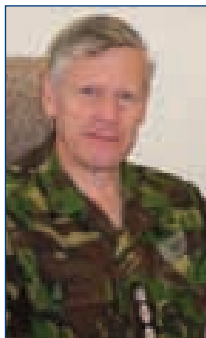

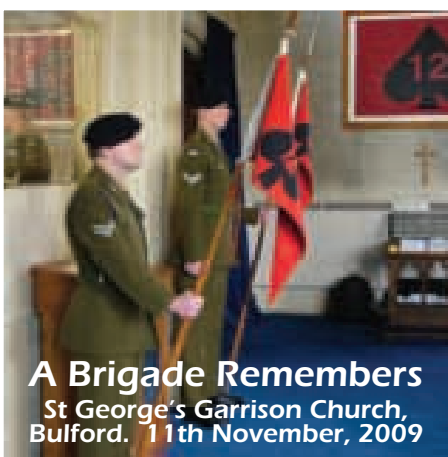
I am extremely grateful to all of you: servicemen and women; civil servants and contractor staff, for the good will, patience and determination you have displayed at a time of major disruption.

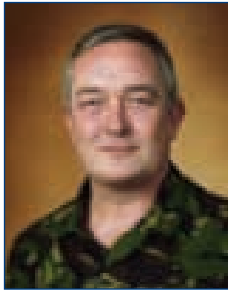

Welcome Home to 4 RIFLES

Soldiers from B Company, 4 RIFLES, have returned home to Bulford after a six-month deployment in Afghanistan. The Company of 128 men went out as part of the Election Support Force and faced some of the most challenging conditions of the campaign so far, playing a key role in the recent Operation Panther's Claw.

Supporting 19 Brigade, the men operated in the Nad-e-Ali District in the southern part of the UK area of operations. The international security forces had only moved into the area for the first time last year, so it was still in the early stages of development. The Riflemen worked



hard through the difficult summer to keep the insurgents at bay and it was a mark of their success that local families started returning to their homes.

B Company's tour was extended by a month just 10 days before they were due to return to the UK. "This reflects the difficult summer we have had", said Commanding Officer Lt Col Jones. "The Riflemen and their families dealt with the disappointment with typical resilience and just got on with it. They know that, with the support of their families, they have done a great job".

Wherever there is a practical task to be done, the Royal Engineers can be depended upon to step up to the mark! **26 Engineer Regiment** has recently completed the initial plant works at the Tidworth Equestrian Centre, (TEC). A detailed design and plan for a levelled arena with french drain, a parade ring and a car park were developed by Cpl O'Dwyer and SSgt Scott, with expert advice and guidance provided throughout the project by Brig Wright from the TEC and Lt Col Ledger from the Garrison Support Unit. Further work by a contractor will put wood chip on the parade ring and sand on the Arena.



This project provided the all-important first step towards an excellent facility for the Garrison and at the same time a fantastic opportunity for the Regiment to gain some plant, project planning and project management training.

A few weeks later, it was the turn of **22 Engineer Regiment** to step in and help by demolishing the old Edwardian stables in Assaye and Aliwal Barracks.



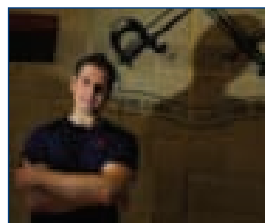

With help and mentoring from Andy Webb from demolition firm Hughes & Salvidge, Ian Caird from Aspire Defence and Lt Col Mick Roberts from PAC, this was a 4-way cooperation to speed Project Allenby on its way.

2RTR celebrates its Battle Honour Day on 20th November in its own unique way.



In Aliwal Barracks, the Regiment held a parade to commemorate its 1917 success ... and in the Gym, SSgt Gareth Heycock, (APTC), who has been serving with 2RTR since July 2007, completed a personal 48-hr challenge: he first ran, rowed and cycled the 269.5 miles between Tidworth and Cambrai; this was followed by a combination of dead lift and bench press to lift a total of 56.8 tonnes - the weight of two Mark IV tanks! The money he raised will go to the 2RTR Benevolent Fund and the APTC Benevolent Fund.

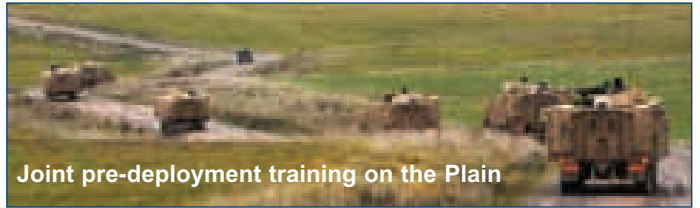

KRH deploys to Afghanistan

Soldiers from The King's Royal Hussars (KRH) have deployed to Afghanistan for the vital role of transporting troops and protecting large convoys in Helmand Province. The soldiers have joined forces with others from 3rd Battalion The Yorkshire Regiment (3 YORKS) to form a "MASTIFF Group" for Op HERRICK 11, deploying with 1st Battalion Coldstream Guards Battle Group.

"The MASTIFF Group will perform a vital role in Afghanistan," said Officer Commanding Major Nick Mackenzie. "They have undergone an intensive training package prior to deployment and are fully prepared for the challenges that lie ahead in Helmand Province."

They will be operating the MASTIFF Protected Mobility Vehicle. It is heavily armoured and is used to transport troops, protect large convoys, as well as to directly engage the Taliban with its advanced weapons systems.

This is the second winter tour of Afghanistan that KRH soldiers have conducted, having previously deployed on Op HERRICK 7.

1RHA in Afghanistan

In April 2009, 1 RHA based in Tidworth, started an intensive 6 month pre-deployment package which prepared the Regiment for Op HERRICK 11 with 11 Light Brigade.

In terms of the Operation itself, we took over as the 750 strong 'Joint Fires & ISTAR Group' from 40 Regiment at 1730 on 6th October. 40 Regt RA gave us a quite superb handover. The constant mentoring at all levels they provided was invaluable, and we remain in their debt. This was the 'Community of Gunners' exemplified.

The Batteries are spread right across the province and are working with several Battle groups including 3 Rifles, Grenadier and Coldstream Guards and the HCR.



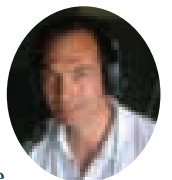

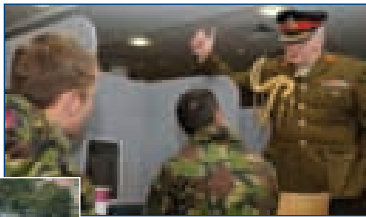


C-in-C visits Swinton Barracks

The new Commander in Chief Land Forces, General Sir Peter Wall KCB CBE, visited Perham Down last month to formally mark the completion of the recently rebuilt Swinton Barracks, home to 22 and 26 Engineer Regiments.

The £121m redevelopment consists of 31 new and 13 refurbished buildings, including 18 36-man junior ranks accommodation blocks, an SNCO 'pair and share' Mess, a junior ranks dining centre, a Regimental Headquarters and a training wing.

Over 750 Sappers now live in their own en-suite rooms with access to kitchens,



utility and communal rooms, built with everything they require within walking distance.

The newly built camp, constructed by Aspire Defence, is part of the £8 billion Allenby/Connaught project which is redeveloping Army barracks in garrisons across Salisbury Plain and Aldershot. The Project has a 35-year life span and is the largest MOD PFI contract to date.

Built on land formerly owned by the MOD, and only 2 miles from Tidworth, the CBC is already providing affordable premises for start-up and micro businesses, several of which are run by serving and ex-service soldiers and their wives too! With extensive business advice and support immediately available, it's becoming a great place from which to run a business. The Innovation Centre will open next Spring to provide a range of innovative and much needed facilities to support businesses across the county.

"We must make sure that soldiers leaving the Army know about this!" Brigadier Steve Hodder, Commander 43 (Wessex) Brigade, told Drumbeat after the ceremony.

The STAG Project

The Sidbury Teenage Action Group (STAG) Committee has been reformed, under guidance from Garrison Headquarters and Sarsen Housing, and a first step has been taken towards preparing the ground for a new sports area to the North of Tidworth. The MOD made the ground available for a sports pitch some years ago but the project, then managed by Tidworth Development Trust, had ground to a halt, with fears that it would fail altogether after TDT's demise.

Alistair Sampson from Environmental Engineering Services has undertaken to level the ground by the end of January; grass seed will then be sown and the pitch should be ready for use by the Autumn.



A Sound Foundation ...



Four years of planning finally came to fruition on 5th November, as the foundation stone of the new school building for Wellington Academy was laid.

Academy Principal, Andy Schofield laid cement upon the foundation stone, watched by some pupils from the Academy,

Stephanie Denovan (Head of Schools and Learning at Wiltshire Council), David Cowley (Chairman of the Academy Governors), representatives from contractors, Kier Moss, and Academy sponsors, Wellington College.

"Our students are very excited to see the building work get underway," said Andy Schofield. "I am delighted with the plans, which will enable us to achieve many of the things we've dreamt of".

"In 18 months' time we are going to be opening the most outstanding school in the country", said David Cowley.

The new academy will include a theatre, a floodlit all-weather sports pitch and the latest ICT facilities throughout its buildings. Boarding for up to 100 students and a Combined Cadet Force will also be available.

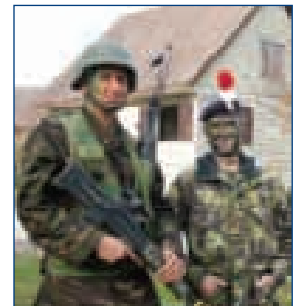
News from 1RRF

Since arriving in Tidworth earlier this year, 1Bn The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers has been fulfilling the role of Land Warfare Centre Battle Group.

Last month, Y Company hosted troops from a Turkish Brigade which had come to the UK to train on Salisbury Plain.

"Our cultures are different, but what we do is similar to UK troops. This is the first time we have come to exercise with British troops in the UK", said Capt Hakan Ozkubat from the Turkish 66th Mechanised Infantry Brigade, pictured above with Major Toby Bunney, OC Y Coy.

"They are members of NATO and the more we work together in a training environment, the better we'll work together on operations", said



Capt Matt Clarke from 1RRF. "They are really great guys and very well drilled. They conduct operations worldwide and they are an excellent, very professional force".

Working through interpreters, the Fusiliers familiarised the Turkish soldiers with British weapons systems, taking them through the moves needed for searching and clearing buildings and then over an assault course constructed in an urban setting.

The following week, the Turkish soldiers put their skills to the test when they joined 1RGR on the Plain ... with the Fusiliers playing the part of 'the enemy' !
