The Royal Welsh : Battalions Merge

Hundreds of soldiers took part in a parade on 3rd April, to formally mark the merger of 1st Battalion The Royal Welsh (formerly Royal Welch Fusiliers) and 2nd Battalion The Royal Welsh (formerly Royal Regiment of Wales). Taffy, the Regimental Goat, led the Band and Bugles of The Rifles onto the Lucknow Barracks parade square in front of more than 500 marching soldiers who were cheered on by friends, family and serving and ex-serving personnel.

The salute was taken by Brigadier Philip Napier, Colonel of the Regiment, who said that the day marked the beginning of the next phase in The Royal Welsh's illustrious 325-year history.

The newly merged unit is **1st Battalion The Royal Welsh** which will be based at Lucknow Barracks. It will be an Armoured Infantry unit at the heart of the Army's Reactive Force - trained, equipped and prepared for deployment both within the UK and around the world.

"Change has been prevalent across the Army, but what's been constant is the Welsh soldier serving with distinction in campaigns across the globe over many years, said Lt Col Shon Hackney, the Commanding Officer.

"In terms of actual losses of numbers, it's quite low. The total number that will make up the new battalion, including our supporting units, is about 800, so we are in good shape and optimistically looking forward to playing a very important role."

Next year The Queen, who is Colonel in Chief of The Royal Welsh, will present new colours to the Regiment.

Prince returns to Tedworth House



HRH Prince Harry visited Tedworth House on 29th April, to launch the selection process of wounded, injured and sick (WIS) Service personnel to be part of the British Armed Forces' team at the Invictus Games in London later this year.

The Invictus Games are being organised with the support and backing of The Royal Foundation of The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry and the Ministry of Defence. Competitors will take part in eight sports : athletics, archery, wheelchair basketball, road cycling, indoor rowing, wheelchair rugby, swimming and sitting volleyball.

Parachuting at Netheravon



The Army Parachute Association has been operating in Netheravon for more than 50 years and its primary objective is to support soldiers who want to take part in the sport, says Brigadier Paul Cain RAMC, the Chairman of the APA.

The club is largely military but is also open to civilian jumpers and caters for all abilities: Beginners can take static line and accelerated freefall courses before progressing to free flying, canopy piloting, formation sky diving and - for the most experienced - wing suiting. The Association has an excellent range of equipment for people to use and it owns three Cessna Caravans, the most modern and safest aircraft used for parachuting. Flying/jumping takes place on Wednesday and Friday afternoons and at weekends, with approximately 24,000 jumps made at Netheravon in 2013 !

Tandem sky-dives are also popular, with many jumps being made to raise money for military charities. In conjunction with BLESMA, the APA has also trained a 4-way sky-diving team comprising of injured Servicemen.

Netheravon hosts the Army Parachute Championships - open to all 3 Services - in August every year, as well as the National Wingsuit Competition. The APA sponsors

military athletes competing at international level, notably Major Anna Hicks (Team 'Isis'), L/Cpl Alex Dand (Team 'Euphoria') and a 4-way team called 'Savoa'. In return, these athletes devote time to help train up-and-coming sky divers, giving them the benefit of their experience in the sport.

The annual Community Awards ceremony took place on 24th April at The Wellington Academy. Certificates were presented to everyone who received a nomination by Mr Patrick Wintour DL OBE, Deputy Lord Lieutenant for Wiltshire. The winners in each category were as follows:

The Schools Challenge Shield goes to an individual or group whose contribution has benefited pupils or a school. This year, the shield was presented to Katie Beamont and Holly Tweed by Karen Ward, Head Teacher of Clarendon Junior School, where the girls are pupils.

The Wiltshire Constabulary (Paul Oatway) Shield for the most valuable contribution to activities for young people was presented to Bdr Thomas Cutler from 1RHA, for his voluntary work as instructor with the Salisbury Army Cadet Force.



The Garrison Commander's Award recognises contributions to the Garrison's involvement locally, from which closer ties between our military and civilian communities have directly resulted.



This year it was awarded to Sarah Simpson, a clerk in the Garrison Headquarters, for her extra work as Secretary to the Tidworth Community Area Partnership. Sarah is also 'Malek' of the Beavers in the Baden Powell Scout Group in Ludgershall. She was presented with her award by Garrison Commander, Colonel James Denny.

The Aster Star, recognising selfless and valuable support given to a neighbour or to the elderly, was awarded to Mr Kim Wheeler-Mallows from Everleigh and presented by Julian Paine from Aster.

The Tidworth & District Chamber of Commerce Cup is awarded to the business that has contributed the most to its local community. This year it was awarded to Liam Abrams and his Showoff Dance School. The award was presented by David Wildman, Chairman of the TDCC.

The Tesco Shield is awarded to the person who has shown the most imagination, determination and commitment in achieving charitable or fundraising targets. This year the Shield was awarded to Carolyn Wall from The Chutes and presented by Lisa Kennedy, Tesco Tidworth's Community Champion.

The Aspire Defence Award for the environment was presented to Karl and Lindie Rogers from Collingbourne Ducis. They were presented with their award by Steve Grantham from Aspire Defence.

The Community Challenge Shield the Community's top award for the year, is selected from the winners of the 7 categories above by the Chairman of the Tidworth Area Board and the TCAA Organising Committee. This year the Challenge Shield was awarded to Liam Abrams.

This year, a **Lifetime Achievement Award** was presented to Major (Retd) Richard Amery, whose work at Garrison Headquarters in conjunction with the SW Regional Development Agency, Defence Estates, local government and military bodies, contributed to the arrival in Tidworth of many of the facilities we take for granted today, eg Tidworth Leisure Centre, Lidl and Tesco supermarkets and a rejuvenated Station Road. The new atmosphere of 'partnership working' led to land being released from the MOD for new housing and the Castledown Business Park, as well as the creation of the Tidworth Community Area Partnership itself.

Congratulations to all, including the other military personnel and dependants who were nominated for their community efforts, including Cpl Yockney (2RTR), Sgt Craig Roocroft (2 R WELSH) and The Tidworth Mums.

Musical entertainment was provided during the evening by choirs and musicians from local schools and the Salisbury Plain Military Wives' Choir.
