Olympic Torch Relay Celebrations



On 11th July, the torch will pass through Ludgershall, Tidworth, Amesbury, The Winterbournes and Salisbury, on its way to the Olympic Games. Tidworth plans a day of celebrations :

Route of the Torch through Tidworth

The Torch will arrive in Tidworth at 17:13 hrs, at the junction of Hill Beech Road on the A3026 from Ludgershall and then join Pennings Road at the junction by The Ram. The torch will be carried along the A338 until the junction with Ashdown Terrace.

The Torch will also be carried through Amesbury on the A345 (arrives at 17:41 hrs) and The Winterbournes

Route of the Torch through Salisbury

The Torch will arrive at Salisbury at 18:12 at the junction with Bishopsdown Road on the A30 London Road. It will be carried along the A30 to St Mark's roundabout, along the Churchill Way then turn up the Castle Road (A345) to Hudson's Field.

13:00 - 22:00 Celebrations at Hudson's Field, Salisbury

Attractions will include : Live Music from Wretch 32, Twist & Pulse, ABBA tribute band Bjorn Again and the Salisbury Plain Military Wives Choir.


The First Minister had the opportunity to meet soldiers and their families before presenting Long Service and Good Conduct medals in the WO's and Sgts' Mess.

KRH in Afghanistan

KRH soldiers from the Transition Support Unit Lashkar Gah have taken part in a partnered operation led by the Afghan police to clear an insurgent hotspot to the east of Lashkar Gah.

Lashkar Gah was the first district in Helmand to transition to Afghan control in 2011 and has continued to make progress to tackle security matters independently. The Lashkar Gah Transition Support Unit, led by The King's Royal Hussars, has moved from a counter insurgency role to focus on the continued training of the Afghan forces, concentrating on improving community policing skills. UK troops continue to support the Afghans as they take the lead and deepen the level of policing through the region.

Support to the Afghan Police

Members of KRH's B Sqn, together with personnel from 1Bn The Welsh Guards, supported 90 Afghan police as they patrolled into the village of Pulpazay, an area which has suffered from insurgent intimidation, extortion and laying of IEDs.

The aim of the operation was to drive out the Taliban, allowing the Afghan forces to conduct policing within the area. This was one of the first joint operations of this scale to be conducted with the Afghan Uniformed Police (AUP) in the district.

Colonel Sattar Khan, Commanding Officer of the Afghan police unit, 1st AUP Kandak (Battalion), said:

"We worked alongside ISAF and caused some damage to the insurgent. I am confident that my police are very capable and soon we should be able to conduct similar operations to this on our own."

Major Chris Badcock, OC B Sqn KRH, said:

"This operation clearly highlights the stage of transition we are in with the Afghan forces. The Afghan police are a very capable force who, when on operations, demonstrate their professionalism and competency to handle themselves in tough situations."

Building a New Police Check Point

As the Afghan Uniform Police take the lead in crime prevention in Helmand province it is increasingly important that the infrastructure upon which they rely is sustainable post-transition.

A new Check Point, CP Samander, has been specially designed and built from local materials, using local methods of construction, enabling easy repair.

The handover was attended by local elders, police officers and representatives from ISAF. The construction of the CP was managed by the Afghan Uniform Police with assistance provided by the partnering force from the KRH

"It has been a tremendous success to see the Afghans develop their own infrastructure and provide a checkpoint made of materials easily and locally sourced", said Major Alex Michael, OC C Sqn, KRH.

This concept is not only environmentally and culturally appropriate but also uses local workers, providing a stimulus to the local economy. CP Samander will act as the prototype for further check points as they are developed in other locations.

News from HomeStart

Home-Start in Wiltshire has been awarded a £80,000 grant from The Armed Forces Community Covenant Scheme to support families with young children in the Tidworth, Bulford and Larkhill garrison areas. Home-Start has been working closely with military families in Wiltshire for more than 20 years, providing support in the home to fragile families in times of distress, helping them to recover and preventing further crisis.

This grant has been awarded to the two independent Home-Starts, Kennet and South Wiltshire, which work in partnership to deliver this family support : Home-Start Kennet in the Tidworth area, and Home-Start South Wiltshire in Bulford and Larkhill.

In the last year, Home-Start Kennet and Home-Start South Wiltshire's 60 volunteers have worked with 90 families and supported over 200 children. They can now continue to train volunteers who will support both the military and civilian communities.

Home-Start was formerly funded by Wiltshire Council but, in common with many other smaller charities, is now reliant on grants and community support.

The Vikings in Afghanistan

The 1st Battalion The Royal Anglian Regiment, (known as the Vikings), is working in the district of Nad-e-Ali, the large agricultural heartland of Central Helmand which stretches between the urban centres of Gereshk and Lashkar Gah.

A (Norfolk) Company has been working closely with Afghan security forces in the Nad-e Ali District since its arrival in Helmand. Following a local tip-off, they have recently uncovered a considerable amount of insurgent narcotics, explosives and supplies.

An initial search by 1 Platoon revealed a 50kg bag of explosives and, during a further search inside the compound, ISAF and Afghan security personnel located a 90kg bag of opium and associated equipment.

"This is a massive knock to the enemy. The opium has an estimated value of \$60,000", said Sgt Terry Johnson.

"The boys did well, relying on their training and each other", said Maj Matt Woodeson, OC A (Norfolk) Company. "With the cooperation of the local nationals and our Afghan partners we have dealt another blow to the insurgent cause".

Patrol Base handed to Afghan Security Forces

Following previous gains made by ISAF and the growing capability of the Afghan security forces, Patrol Base Silab has been handed over to the Afghan National Civil Order Police. This is the first checkpoint to be handed over to Afghan security forces in the Nad-e Ali area and marks a key point in the transition to Afghan security control.

The Vikings, with the help of the Royal Engineers, ensured that the check point was in good order before handing it over, refurbishing the showers and checking that the guard-towers were in a good state. Major Adam Wolfe and the new Commander of Patrol Base Silab, Lieutenant Haji Zainoulla, shook hands officially ending British control of the outpost.

"Both the Afghans and British forces have worked hard to make Silab a place that can be defended and occupied without overstressing either the Afghan security forces or ISAF", said Major Adam Wolfe, OC B (Suffolk) Company. "Its location is a strategic position in the area that places any force in a strong position to deal with the insurgent threat. The professionalism and capability of the Afghans has reached the point where we have confidence in their abilities. I was proud to shake hands with the Commander Zainoulla before we departed; content further progress has been made towards transition".
