4 Military Intelligence Battalion receives the Freedom of Marlborough

On 23rd June, 4 Military Intelligence Battalion, based in Bulford, celebrated the unique honour of being awarded and exercising the freedom of the historic Wiltshire town of Marlborough.

This is the first award of Freedom by the town of Marlborough since it was given its Royal Charter in 1204 and only the second Freedom ever awarded to the Intelligence Corps.

The day began in the grounds of Marlborough College, with an inspection of the troops by the Mayor, Councillor Alexander Kirk Wilson and General Officer Commanding Theatre Troops, Maj Gen Shaun Burley MBE. The 160 soldiers then marched through the town behind the Light

Cavalry Band, along the High Street to a formal ceremony where the Freedom of Entry was awarded and Campaign Medals were presented to 36 members of the Battalion.

Following the awards, the Battalion exercised its Freedom and marched through the town 'with bands playing and bayonets fixed', to cheers and applause from a large crowd and a reception in the Town Hall.

"The Battalion is honoured by this special award", said Commanding Officer, Lt Col Ben Kite. "For us, it has been a a very special day."

4MI Bn has built up a strong rapport with the people and the town of Marlborough over the last couple of years.

Formed in 2001, the Battalion provides intelligence analysts who deploy from Brigade down to Company based level. Their role is the analysis of the environment and insurgent operations; understanding the Afghan people is an important part of their work in Helmand Province.

3DSR returns home



Soldiers from 3rd (UK) Division Headquarters and Signal Regiment returned to Bulford on 18 June after their six-month operational tour to Afghanistan.

More than 270 officers and soldiers from 3DSR had deployed as the inaugural Campaign Signal Regiment, charged with delivering mission-critical communications to the frontline throughout Afghanistan, supporting first 16 (Air Assault) Brigade and later 3 Commando Brigade.

The men and women were welcomed home by family and friends to Picton Barracks in Bulford, and a large number of well-wishing banners.

Amongst the returnees was Corporal Allan Prest, who was greeted by wife Vanessa and three-month-old Ryan who Allan had not yet seen or held.

"I am glad to be back," said Allan. "I have missed the first three months of his life and I just want to get on leave now and spend a good couple of months with him."

Lt Col Greg Wilson, CO 3DSR, said, "I am immensely proud of the soldiers and officers for their professionalism, teamwork and the services they have delivered both in bases across Helmand and on patrol in Kabul. It has been a privilege to have been their Commanding Officer on operations. Everyone can return with their heads held high knowing we have significantly improved communications in theatre.

Equally important I would like to thank all our families and friends for their great support and understanding during this, at times, difficult tour, and particularly the wider British public for the many heartfelt and extremely supportive messages that we received. They were very much appreciated by all and we are immensely grateful."

Cleaning up the Kiwi

The traditional day for 'cleaning up the Kiwi' on the chalk hillside in Bulford is usually Anzac Day, 25th April. When this date turned out to be a Bank Holiday this year, it was decided to postpone the clean up until 7th June - Messines Day. This was an appropriate choice because many of the Antipodeans who trained on the Plain took part in the fighting and died at Messines.

The Clean-up operation was organised by Richard Osgood, DIO's Head of the Historic Environment at Westdown Camp. Volunteers brought their own tools and set to work clearing weeds - rather more this year, following the relative success of the rabbit-proof fence which was installed last year.

Many thanks to everyone who came along to help, including soldiers from 3DSR, members of the Bulford Conservation Group and Landmarc. They were joined by a team from the New Zealand High Commission in London - something which wouldn't have been possible if the clean up had happened on its usual day because the High Commission is heavily involved in many of the Anzac Day celebrations in London.



Rising to The Soldier Challenge

Two teams from 4 CS Bn REME recently took part in the first ever 'Soldier Challenge' event - a fun, urban adventure assault course around the best landmarks of London, with challenges inspired by military life. These include such things as : abseiling off the stand roof at the Oval Cricket Ground, kayaking in a reservoir, playing a game of 'Top Trumps', completing an inflatable assault course in the moat of the Tower of London - or just simply map reading to a checkpoint tied to a tree! There were 309 teams taking part in 'The Soldier Challenge' this year and, whether 'in it' for the competition or just for fun, the organisation from start to finish was second to none and the camaraderie and sense of fun throughout the whole day amazing. Next year's event is planned for May 2012 and is open to teams of two, three or four serving soldiers, dependants or civilians. This event is sure to grow in popularity each year as word of it spreads !
