On Parade for Coronation Day

Coronation Day at Buckingham Palace was marked in unique style on 2nd June, as the ceremonial troops were led off Queens Guard by Regimental Mascot Private Derby XXXI, a Swaledale ram, dressed in his regimental regalia. The regimental mascot of The Mercian Regiment, Pte Derby is the 31st in a line of succession dating back to the Indian Mutiny in the mid-19th Century. Known as "The Heart of England Infantry" the Bulford-based Mercian Regiment soldiers are carrying out ceremonial parade duties during June, July and August at Buckingham Palace, St James's Palace, Windsor Castle and the Tower of London - but Private Derby will only join them for the most auspicious of occasions.

News from the Army Basing Programme

● Preferred Bidder

In Autumn 2016, Lovell was appointed as the preferred bidder to deliver the 917 quarters required across Salisbury Plain for the 4,000 Service personnel and their families returning from Germany to live in this area in 2019. On behalf of the Army Basing Programme, Lovell will be working on three SFA sites (Bulford, Ludgershall and Larkhill) over the next two and a half years.

● Planning Consent

Planning consents have progressed at each of the three sites. Detailed consent for Bulford and Ludgershall should be secured very soon, with Larkhill following shortly afterwards.

Close engagement continues between the Army Basing Programme, Lovell and Wiltshire Council to finalise plans for all three schemes and the associated off-site works. All three sites continue to be cleared by Aspire Defence Ltd ready for handover to Lovell prior to construction start in the Autumn.

● Progress at the Sites

In Larkhill, Rights of Way diversions and temporary access measures have begun. Work has also started on the new roundabout on The Packway. The site for the new school is almost ready to hand over to Wiltshire Council for their builders, Morgan Sindall, to start construction.

In Bulford, all archaeological work is expected to be completed soon.

In Ludgershall, demolition of the temporary accommodation units will soon be complete. It will then be necessary to divert the mains water supply pipe before the final section of concrete hardstanding can be dug up.

Preparations are well under way for improvements to highway junctions, additional pedestrian crossing points and new cycle paths at Army Basing sites in Larkhill, Tidworth, Bulford and Ludgershall over the next 2 years.

● Travel Information

In Larkhill, works are already in progress. The section of The Packway, from the Packway garage to the Stonehenge pub is affected as follows :

4 July - 14 August 2017 : Complete Eastbound highway closure from the Packway Garage to the Stonehenge Inn. Westbound remains open.

14 August - 26 September 2017 : Full highway closure (both directions) from the Packway Garage to the Stonehenge Inn roundabout (access to residential properties and the Packway Garage will be accessible via the diversion routes). Diversion routes will be clearly marked.

September - December 2017 : Traffic light controlled, two way traffic.

Access for pedestrians and cyclists will be available throughout.

The Bulford Kiwi is now a Scheduled Monument

The giant chalk kiwi carved into the side of Beacon Hill near Bulford has been a feature of the Wiltshire Landscape since 1919. It has now joined such monuments as Stonehenge and Hadrian's Wall as a Scheduled Monument protected by law.

It is not the first military carving to receive this recognition; the famous badges at Fovant, also dating from the First World War, are also designated.

The Kiwi was carved to ensure that the New Zealand forces based at Sling Camp who had survived both the War and also the flu pandemic were kept occupied before their embarkation on troopships back to their homeland. Various misdemeanours had made it abundantly clear to their officers that major endeavours such as the creation of this chalk figure were required to help alleviate both boredom and the frustration in delayed departures.

The importance of the Kiwi and the New Zealand contribution in 1914-18 is well recognised locally, with Kiwi School and various New Zealand street names bearing testament. Furthermore, many of the local cemeteries are the last resting place of those men of New Zealand who didn't make it home, including several individuals killed during training at Sling Camp in the foothills of the Kiwi.

The scheduling of the Kiwi Monument is timed to coincide with the centenary of the Battle of Messines, the New Zealanders' key success on the Western Front. This battle included one of the heaviest allied artillery bombardments of the war and was a crucial victory, breaking a stalemate on the Flanders front.

"It's fantastic to see Historic England protecting (a site) of huge importance for New Zealand", said the New Zealand High Commissioner in London, Sir Jerry Mateparae. "The special connections that were forged 100 years ago with communities in the UK where New Zealanders trained, are still strong today".

The High Commissioner is pictured here during a visit to the Kiwi monument last year, talking with Richard Osgood, DIO's Senior Historical Advisor, and Danny Fisher who, while commanding 249 Sig Sqn in 1980, was responsible for rescuing the Kiwi from the undergrowth.

"Huge credit to the British Army for standing by this WW1 war time effort through the years - it wouldn't have survived without your efforts!", said Colleen Brown, a writer from New Zealand whose book about the Bulford Kiwi will be published soon.

Not just a Chef

An Army chef is much more than just a chef and Ex IRON GRIFFIN 17 is the joint 3rd (UK) Division and Force Troops Command (FTC) Cookery and Military Skills Competition designed to provide a competitive arena where military chefs are not only tested on their cooking skills but also the military skills that make them a 'soldier first'!

Having completed a punishing day of military skills on Salisbury Plain, including an eight mile march, a blindfolded rifle strip and an obstacle course, the chefs, comprising of eight teams of three, also competed in two challenges to provide imaginative and tasty food. The first was to provide a 2 course meal for 10 people with ingredients from a standard Army 10 man ration pack, the second to cook a 'feast' using mystery ingredients in an Improved Field Kitchen, using temporary self-built ovens that could be utilised on operational tours.

Divisional Catering Warrant Officer WO1 Roger Hart explained the importance of the exercise:

"It tests the ability of our military chefs to operate in any environment or location, should that be on the Operational Field Catering System (OFCS) or improvised equipment when the supply chain may have broken, using operational ration packs and fresh produce."

As one of the chefs remarked :

"We're not just chefs all the time - we can do military stuff as well!"



Invictus 2017

Cornelia Oosthuizen is a former ETS Major who represented the Army and



Combined Services in several sports during her military career which included a time with 10AEC. She now has reduced mobility due to an injury, but will be competing in wheelchair tennis, swimming, cycling and golf.



Steve Arnold, who lives in Tidworth, is the Vice-Captain of the UK team. Steve served as a Staff Sergeant with 28 Engineer Regiment and lost both of his legs above the knee when he stepped on an IED when leading a search team in Afghanistan in April 2011. Only a couple of months later, he took up hand cycling through the Help for Heroes Sports Recovery Programme and has been selected by

the British Cycling Development Team to race on national and European circuits.

The Invictus Games harness the power of sport to inspire recovery and generate wider understanding and respect for those who serve their country. Getting involved in sport provides significant physical and mental health benefits and more than 300 WIS personnel and veterans applied for one of the 90 places available on the team. Selection criteria included the benefit the Invictus Games will give an individual as part of their recovery, combined with performance and commitment to training.

The UK delegation to the Invictus Games Toronto 2017 is being delivered by a partnership comprising The Ministry of Defence (MOD), Help for Heroes, and The Royal British Legion.

Our Wilton: the Project begins



Work is now underway to transform the former Land Command Headquarters in Wilton into the UK's first housing and enterprise project for Service veterans. This unique multi-million pound project is the creation of regeneration and development specialists, 'Our Enterprise' and it will be the first time in the UK that a development has been built to address the needs of veterans by supporting them into independent living in an integrated community.

Forty-four homes will be built for former Service personnel to rent, for between six to 24 months. During that time they'll receive business and skills training at the enterprise hub, where a range of jobs for veterans will be provided. They will be running the community café on site, as well as their own ground maintenance enterprise and a range of volunteering, training and education opportunities to support their move to independence.

The project is geared towards helping Service veterans to make the move back into civilian life, enabling them to be self-reliant in a culture of enterprise rather than welfare.

Dragons to take on Nessie !

A team of soldiers from 127 (Dragon) Battery, 19th Regiment Royal Artillery (The Scottish Gunners) is planning to swim the length of Loch Ness. As well as celebrating their Scottish heritage, the swim will mark the 175th anniversary of the storming of the fortified city of Chin-Kiang-Foo in July 1842 during the First China War, an action in which the Battery's forebears (B Company, 2nd Battalion, Madras Artillery) took part and the origin of the Battery's name.
