First New Accommodation Blocks in Tidworth



The first three Junior Ranks' Single Living Accommodation blocks to be completed in Tidworth have been handed over to 1 Royal Horse Artillery (1RHA).

"I am delighted to witness the acceptance into service of these three magnificent single living accommodation blocks", Deputy Garrison Commander Colonel Richard Aubrey Fletcher told Drumbeat. "It is remarkable what has been achieved; little under a year ago buildings completed in 1905 still stood on this site.

"The fact that we can now begin to provide single members of the Garrison with decent facilities is down to sheer hard graft and outstanding cooperation by all concerned. Aspire Defence Capital Works deserve a huge pat on the back and my thanks also go to all those involved from Aspire Defence Services, my own Headquarters and the Project Central Management Team.

"There is a way to go before everyone benefits from the investment being made - but this is an outstanding start!"

The new accommodation blocks consist of six 6-man flats, each with communal kitchen, living, utility and storage areas.

"1RHA has suffered the most inconvenience during the first year of demolition and reconstruction work", Major (Retd) Richard Luedicke from the Garrison Management Team told Drumbeat. "For example", he continued, "their only access to their Regimental Headquarters has been through a building site! We are therefore very pleased that soldiers from 1RHA will be the first to benefit from the new Z scale accommodation".

A GEM of an idea ...



Sgt Jim Randall REME, from the LAD UK Engineer Group in Iraq, has been awarded a GEMS Certificate of Merit for designing a piece of kit called a 'Command Wire Hook MKIII' which is now being used in Theatre to help soldiers detect hidden command wires while out patrolling the streets of Basra.

His invention is essentially a two-pronged hook on a long handle which can be dismantled quickly and stowed in a day sack whilst in transit. The hook is dragged behind the soldier to alert him to the existence of hidden command wires.

GEMS is the MOD-wide scheme which encourages, recognises and rewards ideas or contributions made by any member of staff, whether military or civilian, which are put into practice. Sgt Randall's Command Wire Hook is already being used on operations and could possibly save lives.

Fighting the Flood ...

Headquarters staff from Bulford-based 43 (Wessex) Brigade have been working in the Gold Operations Centre at Gloucester Police HQ, coordinating military involvement in 'Op OUTLOOK', to bring help to those affected by the severe flooding in the Severn Valley.



Personnel from all 3 Services have helped to rescue trapped civilians, to deliver fresh water supplies and to fight the flood water at vital power stations and other strategic sites in Gloucester and Tewkesbury. It was their efforts that ensured that power supplies to much of the county were maintained.

At command level, Brigadier Jackson, Commander 43 (Wx) Bde, worked closely with the Chief Constable and senior representatives from Severn Trent Valley Water, the Environment Agency, Gloucestershire County Council, the Health Authority, the National Grid and has personally briefed the Prime Minister and COBRA.

With the operations still far from over, he paused to thank everyone that had taken part so far:

"Because regional brigades are not seen or regarded as 'frontline' as an operational brigade would be, it does not mean we do not have our moments," he said.

"For the second time in a matter of weeks we have been involved in a major operation. I believe that all around the UK brigades like ours have a significant role to play.

"Every soldier, sailor and airman involved in Operation Outlook certainly gets my thanks. They worked for long hours often in cold and difficult conditions. They have brought credit on themselves and to the Services, and our already excellent standing with the British public has been further enhanced by their efforts."

Fire Safety Advice

Top 12 Tips to make your home safer :

- Check your smoke alarm once a week and change battery yearly where disposable batteries are fitted.
- Make a fire action plan - plan your escape route from every room.
- Take care when cooking with hot oil - consider using a thermostatically controlled deep fat fryer.
- Never leave lit candles unattended.
- Ensure cigarettes are extinguished and disposed of carefully.
- Never smoke in bed.
- Keep clothing and other fabrics (curtains etc.) away from heating appliances.
- Take care while cooking - accidents whilst cooking account for 59% of all fires within the home.
- Keep all matches and lighters away from children.
- Take care when tired or when you have been drinking. Half of all deaths in domestic fires occur between 10pm and 8am.
- Do not remove internal doors as these protect your escape route, delay the spread of fire and reduce smoke damage
- Before retiring to bed or leaving the house ensure all unnecessary electrical equipment is switched off and all internal doors are closed.

Building a better future in Basra

The British aid and development programme is a vital part of the 1 Mechanised Brigade mission, the aim being to build a better future for the people of Basra and across southern Iraq. There are over 30 of these CIMIC (Civil & Military Cooperation) projects around the city, ranging from building schools and primary health-care centres to foot bridges and water treatment plants. The work is fraught with problems as many local contractors are liable to be intimidated by terrorists and other anti-Iraqi forces.

70 Children and 16 staff from the charity-sponsored Al Seedeqah Orphanage recently visited the 4 RIFLES Battle Group in Basra Palace, where Captain Rob Cutler and his team are responsible for ensuring that the British army in Basra is remembered for things other than just soldiers patrolling in armoured vehicles and carrying guns.



During the visit, several areas where the CIMIC team from 4 RIFLES could help the orphanage were identified, ranging from providing stationery to building a perimeter fence and improving classroom facilities. Whilst these issues were being discussed, the children were entertained by the medical staff and the Padre, Father Danny Hernandez.

"In the medical centre we have to deal with some horrible situations and it was a welcome change to experience something different", said Sgt Docherty, one of 4 RIFLES medical staff. "The children were great fun, playing games ... It was good to see some happiness in what can sometimes be a hostile environment."

4 RIFLES also arranged a First Aid training day for the village elders of Meytan, near Basra Palace. In the past, casualties have died due to the lack of first aid available prior to arriving at hospital. It is hoped that, with these newly acquired skills, the number of fatalities will be reduced.

Don't let it happen to you ! Don't drink from a bottle you haven't seen opened and don't ever leave a drink unattended. If in doubt, leave. Report your fears to the Police and seek medical attention.

Project Allenby : the first year

On 10 July 07, Project Allenby/Connaught celebrated its first anniversary since Service Commencement. The Project covers Aldershot, Warminster, Larkhill and TidNBul Garrisons, which is 20% of the Army's strength. This is what has been achieved in this Garrison alone :

Service Provision :

The Aspire Defence help desk has operated on average at 97% efficiency in answering & dealing with calls received - a remarkable achievement ! It is of critical importance to us to know that our Garrison customers can be confident that, if the help desk is called, service will follow shortly after.

Construction :

The very tight time deadline for the construction of the new Barracks for 2 RTR has been met. The demolition, reconstruction and renovation programme for the rest of the Garrison continues according to schedule, which will lead eventually to Tidworth, Netheravon & Bulford Garrison becoming the largest in the UK.

Some Statistics :

- 20 major buildings have been cleared, releasing 200 beds, 250 office desks & over 500 chairs for redistribution
- Consumable items issued include 450,000 plastic knives, forks and spoons; 800,000 plates or bowls and 900,000 cups
- 56,700 security passes have been issued in Tidworth including 20,000 at Gate 17 for building contractors
- The Garrison Theatre has hosted 98 operational briefings to a total of 31,000 troops, breaking all previous records
- The TLC has had a record 217,000 customers
- 25,600 items of clothing have been laundered
- 38,000 items of clothing have been tailored, of which 25,600 were badges.
- 100,000 man hours have been expended directly into improving existing buildings.
- The Garrison repro-graphics department has produced over 2,675,000 photocopies.
- 33,363 statutory inspections have been carried out
- 34,957 remedial maintenance tasks have been completed
- 18 new buildings have been accepted into service
- 23 Infrastructure surveys have been carried out
- The TNB Garrison Help Desk has received 34,581 calls - 46% of the 75,013 received across all four Garrisons.

A great deal has been achieved over the past 12 months and it is important that we continue to build on our achievements as we enter the second year of service delivery.

News from the Tidworth NPT

These are the priorities for the Tidworth Neighbourhood Policing Team, identified in their most recent survey :

Litter & Fly Tipping : a joint approach to deal with this is being taken by Tidworth Town Council, Kennet, MOD & partners, Sarsen Housing and all policing agencies, with Tidworth Town Council taking the lead.

Speeding on the Zouch Estate : This is being tackled jointly by Wiltshire Police, MOD police and the RMP and will involve speed checks in the area.

'Boy Racers' : Again, there is a joint approach by the three policing agencies to combat this. This is also a priority of the Ludgershall Neighbourhood Policing Team and it appears that the same drivers/vehicles are involved.

The NPT partners will be carrying out the next Consultation soon and will be visiting homes, local groups and events in the process. We look forward to meeting you.



Garrison Soldiers Honoured

The bravery of Officers and soldiers from this Garrison has been recognised in the Armed Forces Operational Honours list published on 19 July 2007. Three soldiers from the Staffordshire Regiment have been Mentioned in Despatches (MiD). This is the oldest form of recognition of gallantry within the Armed Forces and, since 1993, it has been reserved for active operations.

While commanding a Warrior armoured personnel carrier, **Corporal David Lovell** was quick to react when another Warrior in the patrol came under attack and one soldier was killed and four others wounded. Corporal Lovell went alongside the stricken vehicle and co-ordinated the evacuation of the wounded to a field hospital.

Throughout the tour, **Major Michael Ross** showed great gallantry, leading his men from the front. "His ability to encourage his men to work quickly and accurately was unsurpassed, as was his personal example, planning, understanding and total disregard for his own safety."

During a joint security operation, **Corporal Jason Smith** helped maintain the offensive spirit throughout the night, extracted two wounded colleagues and returned to destroy an enemy team who were laying improvised explosive devices. His gallant actions, willingness to take the fight to the enemy and his determination not to be pushed back, ensured the mission's success.

Staff Sergeant Wayne McEachran, 1 STAFFORDS, has received the Queen's Commendation for Valuable Service (QCVS), which recognises meritorious service during, or in support of, operations.

The Commanding Officer of the Staffordshire Regiment, **Lieutenant Colonel Tim Sandiford**, is made an Officer of the British Empire (OBE). He commanded 473 officers and men during an intense six-month operational tour of Iraq when they carried out 23 complex strike and detention operations. D Sqn KRH leads re-supply convoy



On Thursday 21 Jun 07, D Squadron King's Royal Hussars (KRH) of 1 Mechanised Brigade Manoeuvre Battlegroup mounted Op OCTAVIA 9, a regular operation to re-supply the Borders North Battlegroup in the desert of Maysaan Province. Their task was to ensure the safe and timely passage of the large convoy of soft skinned logistical vehicles from the Contingency Operations Base (COB) to the Forward Operating Base (FOB) of Borders North Battlegroup (BN BG).

The convoy consisted of over 130 personnel and 30 vulnerable vehicles carrying fuel and materiel, including aviation fuel, vehicles and spares, critical to the BN BG's continued operation in their remote location. A complex logistical move, the convoy represented a combined effort from a variety of cap badges from within the COB: The King's Royal Hussars provided intimate protection whilst personnel from 32 Sqn, 3 Logistic Support Regiment drove their specialist logistic vehicles; soldiers from 1 Royal Horse Artillery and Cyclops Sqn 2 Royal Tank Regiment provided additional dismount troops and the ever dependable REME contingent provided Equipment Support to the convoy.

The journey was 500 Kms and some 45 hours of driving on road surfaces that varied from motorway to rough desert track, by both day and night. The convoy's route took it through the Ramalah oil fields and several towns and villages, including Al Qurnah and Qal It Salih. It snaked through both marshland and arid desert where at one point the troops were witness to a vast herd of camels crossing the route ahead.

Enemy action combined with harsh conditions and severe heat had an effect on the mechanical operation of the vehicles and caused some delay to the convoy. The crews of the affected vehicles and the attached REME mechanics worked extremely hard in difficult conditions and succeeded in either repairing the failed vehicles or loading them up and carrying them, using the limited spare capacity of the convoy's many vehicle transporters.

Despite some delays and an extended stop-over at its destination, the FOB, the convoy returned safely to the COB having achieved its vital mission to sustain the Borders North Battlegroup. This success was clearly thanks to the dogged determination and professionalism of all the soldiers involved, who maintained their high morale and fighting spirit during what was a long and dangerous journey.

Besides the Rundle Cup match, traditionally played between the Army and the Royal Navy, the day's events included a charity polo match on both horses and bikes, a charity wheelchair race and the Indian Cavalry Officers Trophy match, which saw a Combined Services team lose to a team from the United States.



This year marks the 100th anniversary of Tidworth Polo Club which was founded in 1907, when cavalry regiments based on and around Salisbury Plain needed somewhere to develop the polo playing skills they had picked up during postings to India. In those days the grounds were rough and uneven, but 15 years later the Brigade Commander, Brigadier Bertie Fisher, built the main polo ground - now called the Fisher Ground - which is where the Rundle Cup is held today.
