

Television Award for 1 Staffords



The Staffordshire Regiment has been awarded the BBC Midlands Today award, "Midlander of the Year 2005". The programme invited viewers to send in their own nominations and it very quickly became clear that 1 Staffords were being voted for by a wide spectrum of the community, irrespective of their views, because the people of Staffordshire and the West Midlands thought that the Regiment's achievements in Iraq needed to be recognised.

Pictured here, holding the award, are Pte Steven Baldwin and Pte Edeli Uluilakeba, who were both badly injured in an incident during Op Telic VI in which three other men lost their lives.



"We were deeply honoured and very pleased to receive this award, especially when we saw what the other nominees had achieved, either by overcoming their own personal difficulties or the selfless way they had acted on behalf of others", Commanding Officer Lt Col Tim Sandiford told Drumbeat. "It is reassuring to know that, whenever we are away, we are held in such esteem and have such great support from the people of Staffordshire and the West Midlands".

2005 was the Tercentenary year for The Staffordshire Regiment and the Presentation of Colours, postponed because of Op Telic VI, will take place later this year.

Exercise NORDIC SHIELD

Exercise NORDIC SHIELD was an exercise that took place in Norway at the end of November and first 3 weeks of December, involving British, Norwegian and Danish troops.



The exercise was run as a Command Post Exercise, meaning there were no troops actually on the ground and their presence was simulated by computer. NORDIC SHIELD was designed to test the headquarter elements in their battle procedures. Taking part in the exercise was a headquarters called the Joint Task Force Headquarters which included specialist components such as Land, Air, Maritime, Special Forces and Logistics. HQ 1 Mech Brigade deployed as the Land Component.

The three weeks on exercise were split into 3 main phases. First there was a series of study days, reviewing the procedures we would use. The strength of the headquarters was swollen to around three times its normal size and all the augmentees (including a sizable Norwegian crew) needed to understand how we were going to be operating. We also studied the scenario. The exercise was run in Norway but ironically we were practicing preparing for an operation in West Africa. The scenario was loosely based around the political situation as it was in Rwanda in 1994, but played out in a fictitious country called Mabole. We studied historic cases where the threat of genocide was high as well as learning all about hypothetical Mabole.



The second phase of the exercise was the planning phase. We spent a week determining exactly what needed to be done and just how we were going to carry out the tasks we had identified. The final phase then was the execution phase. The Land Component had to carry out routine operations as well as dealing with issues such as helicopter crashes, civil disturbances, the massacre of civilians in a village and breaches of a ceasefire agreement.

The exercise went smoothly and soldiers of all nationalities were able to take away with them several lessons learnt. It wasn't all work, work, work though. We were fortunate enough to have the weekends off and we were able to escape to the surrounding areas including the nearby ski slopes. In the evenings, a bar with tax-free beer put on a series of bands and shows.

Bulford Courts Martial Centre



Work is progressing well on the new Courts Martial Centre in Bulford. Contractors, Mansell Construction, held a 'topping out' ceremony at the site at the beginning of January and work is on course for the Centre to be completed by mid June.

Designers and Architects have worked closely with Defence Estates and the Military Court Service to produce plans for a bespoke and sustainable building which will make the most of natural light, as well as being sound-proof to prevent Court proceedings being interrupted by the jets from Boscombe Down!

The new Courts Martial Centre will have two Court Rooms, a vulnerable witness suite, interview rooms and office accommodation for Prosecution and Defence Counsel, Judges, Court Members and Court Staff. It will be used by the Military Court Service for all Courts Martial and associated hearings from the 5 Division area and will be able to deal with high profile cases which generate interest from the public and the press.

"The new Court Centre at Bulford is one of three now under construction for the Military Court Service, the other two being at Colchester and Catterick," Court Officer Lt Col (Retd) Ray Aldis told Drumbeat. "These projects clearly demonstrate the Armed Forces' commitment to its Courts Martial system and will enable military justice to be conducted in purpose-built modern facilities for the foreseeable future".

The new Centre is being built adjacent to Ward Barracks; members of the public and the press will be able to enter the building from Vimy Crescent, 'outside the wire', while Court members will continue to have access from inside the Camp.

Residents' Forum Round-up

500 New Houses planned for Tidworth

350 military quarters and 150 civilian houses are to be built on the NE Quadrant to the north of Tidworth, a 35-acre area of ground owned by the Ministry of Defence, bordered by Pennings Road and Ludgershall Road. Studies are being undertaken with the Environment Agency, the Highways Authority, Kennet District Council and other relevant bodies and a public exhibition is planned for the end of February/beginning of March to identify any particular issues.

Rubbish Collections

Black plastic rubbish sacks for household waste will gradually be phased out in favour of black 'wheelie bins'. The new bins should arrive from April onwards with the new collection system due to start on 3rd July.

Great Bustards are on the move !

The second year of the Great Bustard reintroduction is progressing well, and the birds are demonstrating some typical Great Bustard behaviour.

Great Bustards are loyal in respect of their summer and breeding grounds, but typically move away in the autumn to wintering grounds. The birds would then return to the summer grounds in the spring. Males and females live separately, and will not mix until they are old enough to breed (3-4 years).

In October 2005 we had good reports and photographs of one of our Bustards released in August flying over Portland Bill in Dorset. This bird has been seen a few times since in Dorset, and another flock of males is also living in that county. A female Great Bustard from the project was seen in Brittany in the middle of December and another sadly died on New Years day after flying into powerlines in the Loire valley, east of Nantes, France. Other birds are still living on Salisbury Plain.

This dispersal is quite natural and the distances covered are comparable with the dispersal of Great Bustards in other populations. A Great Bustard would be able to fly from Salisbury Plain to Brittany in a day, and their return by the early summer is predicted, so there is no worry that the birds have simply disappeared.

In historical times there was a debate as to whether or not the English Great Bustards all lived in the UK throughout the year. The consensus of those early ornithologists was that some English birds went to Europe and some European birds came to England. Our current experience is supporting this.

Foxes did kill some birds after they were released, but this is both an expected and natural occurrence as this is when the young birds are vulnerable and not 'street wise'. Due to the dispersal of the Bustards it is not possible to state how many birds have been killed in total; the situation will not be clear until the early summer when the birds return to Salisbury Plain. However, from the number of sightings, it is clear that this, our second year, has been significantly more successful than the first.

Some of the released birds were carrying small radio transmitters attached to a tail feather. These will start to fall out now as the bird naturally moults. The Great Bustard Group would be very grateful if any sightings of the Great Bustards were reported to the Great Bustard Group. (Contact details below).

The project is now in its second of what may be up to ten years of annual releases. A significant boost has been given to the project by generous funding given by two local landfill site operators. : Cleansing Service Group (CSG) have provided £10,000 and RWE Npower £24,483. This support will go a long way towards the cost of running the project in 2006. Main areas of expenditure are the operations in Russia, (including the rearing and release of Great Bustards into the wild in Russia), provision of quarantine and release facilities in Wiltshire and the community and education work of the project. Over 2000 people have visited the release site on escorted tours and about 200 presentations a year are made to organisations ranging from schools and youth groups to conservation groups and pensioner clubs.

Defence Estates Housing Directorate News ...

The new Housing Prime Contract began on 30th January. The new Prime Contractor is MODern Housing Solutions (MHS), a consortium made up of Carillion plc, WS Atkins and Enterprise (Call Centre).

MHS will provide all aspects of property maintenance including building fabric, services, grounds maintenance and provision of carpets and curtains.

From now on, repairs and works will be supplied to all our quarters in a different way.

Reporting repairs ...

MHS Helpline ... 0800 - 707 6000

All repairs should now be reported via the MODern Housing Solutions Helpline call centre which will be manned 365 days a year, 24 hours a day. The call centre will diagnose the problem, allocate a priority (Emergency, Urgent or Routine, as before), and arrange an appointment directly with you.

From 30 Jan Defence Estates Housing Directorate Customer Care Officers are no longer be responsible for any repairs.

Frequently asked Questions ...

Who is now responsible for the repair to my house which I reported a few weeks ago ?

Some of the repairs which have already been reported to the previous contractor (Turners) are now being returned to Defence Estates, undone. These jobs will be passed on to MHS.

The ones which are not returned will be completed by Turners before the end of March.

For further information, please contact your Customer Care Officer.

I have heard that we no longer have to clean our quarters when we march out. Is this true ?

No it is not true ! In this respect, the new system is not fundamentally different to the old one. We will still have to leave our quarters clean; specific things that need to be done will be pointed out during the "pre march out".

I already have the address of the quarter I have been allocated for my new posting. Surely the Housing people must know I am coming ?

You may have a piece of paper with an address on it, but if sufficient notice of your arrival has not been given to Defence Estates Housing Directorate at the location you are moving to, then you will not be able to move in.

This is because, under the new Prime Contract, MHS will hold the keys to any property which is empty to enable them to carry out any work that needs doing. The new contract stipulates that MHS must be given 15 working days notice of a family needing the house.

Therefore, it is vitally important to remember that you must confirm your march-in date at least 15 working days (**ie three weeks**) before you want to move in.

I have been promised new carpets and curtains. When will this happen ?

No new orders for carpets or curtains could go in before the Prime Contract started, so be patient and things should start to move by mid February.

MOD Wins a Butterfly Conservation Award

The Ministry of Defence has won a major conservation award for coming to the rescue of the beleaguered British butterfly. Butterflies face constant threats from modern farming and forestry practices and from creeping urbanisation. Worryingly, many of our British Butterflies are now in decline. However, military training requires vast tracts of land - and many areas have been spared from intensive farming and development. Salisbury Plain's enormous expanse of grassland offers a unique habitat to many of our threatened butterflies. In summer, the Plain is awash with colourful swathes of wild flowers which provide important feeding and breeding areas for a range of butterflies. For example, the endangered Marsh Fritillary butterfly depends on Devil's-bit Scabious, the favoured food-plant for its caterpillars. Two rare moths - the Pale Shining Brown and the Narrow-bordered Bee Hawk - are also doing well on Salisbury Plain.

Defence Estates, the MOD's land and property agency, has adopted a policy of positive management on many sites to provide ideal habitats for butterflies and moths. This has been recognised by the Butterfly Conservation Society who nominated the MOD for this year's award. Dr Martin Warren, who heads up the Butterfly Conservation Society said: "They've really earned this award. It is of major international importance that land on Salisbury Plain is now a haven for the highly threatened Marsh Fritillary butterfly"



The Marsh Fritillary

On Salisbury Plain, Defence Estates have cleared away scrub to produce a flower-rich grassland which is perfect for butterflies and many other insects. Trees and scrub can act as a barrier to butterflies, stopping them colonising new areas. By clearing scrub and trees in the Northern part of Bulford ranges, a corridor has been created through which butterflies and other invertebrates can migrate. Grazing cattle on the Plain also improves the quality of the grassland. The overall coverage of grazing pens has been extended and a herdsman introduced to allow cattle to graze freely during the day without the restriction of fences on the west of the Plain.

Salisbury Plain is one of Europe's most important grasslands, full of rich and surprising wildlife. The continuing efforts of the MOD, English Nature and the Butterfly Conservation Society are helping to ensure that butterflies and their habitats will survive long into the future.
