The Tidworth 10K & 3K Fun Run 2006



A Record Turnout !

Hundreds of runners took part in the annual Tidworth 10K and 3K Fun Run last month.

500 runners took the 10K route onto the Plain and over wooded hills before returning to the starting point on the Lucknow-Mooltan Playing Fields, while 200 others of all ages and abilities, completed 3K by circling the field. They all had one thing in common : to raise funds for the

Pembroke Cancer Unit at Salisbury District Hospital. The event was organised by HQ 1 (Mechanised) Brigade & Signal Squadron (215), with support from Salisbury District Hospital's Fundraising Office and, with 700 people taking part, is on course to break last year's fundraising record of £12,000 !

A team of eight keen KRH troops recently competed in the gruelling Cambrian Patrol Competition, held in the Black Mountains in Wales. The competition was a forty eight hour patrolling task, including challenges such as a tactical river crossing and close target recces.

The KRH team had been in training for five weeks, honing their infantry skills in preparation, leaving behind their beloved tanks for black taxis and bergans !

Project Allenby : Water Conservation

Water is a precious resource and an essential part of everyday life. We take its availability for granted, but more and more we need to be taking steps to use it more efficiently in the interests of conservation.

Aspire Defence has incorporated the need to use water efficiently into the design for Project Allenby/Connaught. The nature and scale of the contract have provided a unique opportunity to implement a number of water conservation measures in line with our holistic approach to sustainability.

Water Monitoring & Efficiency, including Leakage Reduction

Levels of consumption will vary considerably, and clearly, to be able to demonstrate improvements in efficiency, we will have to understand just what the raw demand for water is. To this end, some 800 water meters will be linked to a sophisticated software system, creating one of the largest estate-wide systems anywhere in the country. The metering programme will also help address the key issue of water leakage from pipework, where losses underground can often go unnoticed for long periods.

Added to this, many of the new buildings will be provided with low water consumption items including taps, showers and low flush toilets and all new buildings must receive an 'excellent' rating using the Building Research Establishment Environmental Assessment Methodology (BREEAM).

Harvesting Rainfall

With excessive abstraction endangering water resources and, conversely, run-off during heavy rainfall contributing to flooding, one way to simultaneously give the twin benefits of reducing water demand whilst also preventing increased levels of run-off, is to harvest rainfall for use in non drinking applications.

Rainwater will be collected from the roofs of about 100 buildings at three of the MoD sites on Salisbury Plain: Tidworth, Perham Down and Bulford. These systems work by diverting the collected water to an underground water storage tank. This collected rainwater is then pumped to header tanks within the buildings and then gravity fed to individual toilet cisterns and urinals. The rainwater collection/distribution system will work in conjunction with a mains water feed to ensure toilet flushing water demand is satisfied, all year round and at all peak times.

Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems (SUDS)

Traditionally, surface water is drained away via a network of pipes into rivers, etc. However, increases in run-off from new building developments can result in changes to existing natural flow patterns which in turn can cause flooding or erosion elsewhere within the catchment area.

Sustainable Urban Drainage Systems (SUDS) is the term used for the combination of the various technologies designed to avoid these problems. Other benefits of SUDS include enhanced pollution control and reduced infrastructure capital and maintenance costs. Aspire has incorporated a number of SUDS features into the masterplan designs, including :

- Several ponds with native marginal planting (reed beds) offering a cleaning function to treat contaminants in the run-off, as well as providing an ecological amenity and landscape feature in areas of new development;
- A number of swales (grassy depressions in the ground) and soakaway features will help to control peak levels of water during high rainfall;
- Permeable paving will be used for car parks as a method of infiltrating water into groundwater, thereby reducing the loading put on the drainage system.

In summary, Project Allenby/Connaught and Aspire have jointly addressed the important issue of water conservation and implemented a variety of measures as part of an integrated approach to sustainability.

'Academy' option is being considered for East Wiltshire

Following conversations with the Department for Education and Skills, officers of Wiltshire County Council have been working with the governors and head teachers of Castledown School, Tidworth, and Avon Valley College, Durrington, to explore the possibilities of establishing a twin-site academy to serve secondary pupils in East Wiltshire.

The proposal under consideration could lead to the two schools being replaced with new buildings in each community and coming together under one executive head and one board of governors.

As a part of the Government's academies programme, the new institution would have a sponsor, which would take significant responsibility for the success of the academy, and would work closely with both communities to ensure the very best secondary education for all the children and young people of the area. Wellington College, the independent school based in Crowthorne, Berkshire, is interested in exploring if it could play such a role.

Discussions are at a very preliminary stage; if the proposals are advanced further, all local stakeholders, particularly present and future parents and children in the area, will have the opportunity to express their views before any final decision is made.

Academies are free, all-ability, state schools. To date, almost all academies have been established in urban areas and have replaced schools that have faced challenging circumstances, but Academies are also being introduced to meet specific local needs in city and rural areas.

The Wiltshire proposal could lead to a trailblazing rural academy which is founded on the strengths of the two existing schools, although it is unlikely it could open before 2010.

Castledown Radio On air now at 104.7 FM

Castledown Sports Centre buzzed with anticipation as Baz Reilly, the manager of the new station, hit the "on air" button for Castledown radio to go live for the first time to people living in the Tidworth Community Area. "It has taken several years to get here and an incredible amount of hard work by many people", said Steve Lawton, Chief Executive of Tidworth Development Trust, holder of the FM licence for the new radio station.

The Tidworth Community Area consists of the parishes of the Chutes, the Collingbournes, Everleigh, Tidcombe, Fosbury, Tidworth, Ludgershall and Perham Down.

"Even though we have only been on the internet up until now", Baz Reilly said, "it has already helped bring the villages together. This is what community radio is all about. If you want to hear something in particular on the radio, then just let us know what it is!"

This is the secret to success in life, according to Andy McNab, speaking at the Garrison Theatre last month. Andy was invited to Tidworth by 10 Army Education Centre as part of their Military History Month. Andy spoke about his life and afterwards faced some tough questions about how his writing fitted in with his career in the Army and in particular the Special Forces.



"It is not all James Bond and jumping through windows", he joked. "What they are looking for is your ability to learn. It's all about getting smart. It is like that all through life. It is thanks to the Army that I learned to read and write properly, so get on down to the Education Centre !"

Another speaker during Military History Month was Richard Holmes, Professor of Military and Security Studies at Cranfield University and the Defence Academy of the United Kingdom.



A well known author and television presenter, Professor Holmes is also a Brigadier in the Territorial Army and Colonel of the Princess of Wales's Royal Regiment. His books include a trilogy on the British soldier : 'Redcoat', 'Sahib' and 'Tommy'. His more recent book, "Dusty Warriors", describes 1PWRR's experiences on Op Telic 4. "The character of the British soldier has not changed very much over the centuries!", Professor Holmes told his audience at the Garrison Theatre.
