And we like to call ourselves "The Best"?

The photographs on the cover of this issue of Drumbeat demonstrate that we simply do not deserve this title when it comes to looking after the Estates on which our families live. Drumbeat normally focuses on positive aspects of Garrison life, but in this issue I have no hesitation in highlighting our collective failure to look after our home environment, particularly the wholly unacceptable level of fly tipping taking place.

Garrison Headquarters works with Units, Defence Estates, the Ministry of Defence Police and Modern Housing Solutions to clear up bulk rubbish dumped on an almost daily basis across the Garrison Estates. But this would not be necessary were married personnel to discharge their responsibilities as both soldiers and citizens. There is no need to fly tip. Yes, it might take some effort to arrange bulk rubbish collection or visit the local recycling centre but by not doing so we damage our environment and community well being. We do not accept such conduct on operations and there is no reason why we should behave any differently here at home. Such ill-discipline is damaging our reputation locally; and it is no good saying that the civilian housing estates are just as bad. I have been to see them and they are not.

Over the next month Garrison Headquarters will be working with Units to clear up the Garrison Estates. Thereafter I expect all married personnel to take greater pride in their community; keep gardens clean and tidy, pick up litter, dispose of bulk rubbish correctly and encourage others to comply with these simple social and military norms.

New Junior Ranks Single Living Accommodation completed in Perham Down



All 22 Engineer Regiment and 26 Engineer Regiment soldiers are now housed in new, permanent, Z-scale accommodation following the handover of the final Junior Ranks Single Living Accommodation block (JRSLA) in Perham Down last month.

This is the first 'accommodation village' to be completed under Project Allenby/Connaught. It comprises 18 JRSLAs and four 8-man houses which, together with the new SNCO Mess, provides 760 soldiers with their own en-suite rooms.

Other buildings already in use within the barracks include the training wing, 3 refurbished technical buildings, an obstacle course, a new guardroom/armoury and a gym, which were all delivered early to meet operational requirements.

The Super Diner is still under construction, along with the Regimental Headquarters, which will be handed over in 2009. The only accommodation yet to be completed are the Officers' Messes which are listed buildings.

The soldiers are delighted with their new rooms, with more choosing to stay here at the weekends!

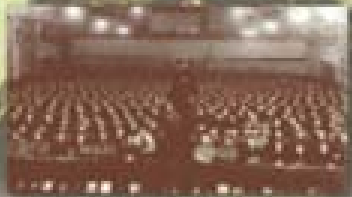

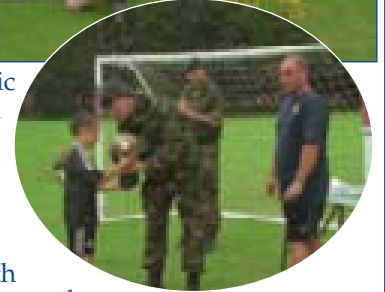

Innovation through Challenge

Salisbury Plain was host to the final of the MOD's 'Grand Challenge' last month, the first major MOD competition of its kind. The aim of the competition was to inspire and encourage new technologies to find solutions to the problems faced on a daily basis by Britain's Armed Forces on active operations.

The Challenge : to produce a system with a high degree of autonomy able to detect, identify, locate and report the position of a wide range of military threats within an urban environment.

23 teams with backgrounds in industry, universities, colleges and schools took up the challenge, launched in November 2006. Of those teams, 11 reached the Grand Challenge, which took place over a period of 10 days at Copehill Down, the Army's purpose built FIBUA on Salisbury Plain - 10 days which saw some of the worst weather conditions we have had on the Plain this year ! 7 teams reached the final, competing for the RJ Mitchell Trophy, named after the designer of the Spitfire aeroplane which earned legendary status for its decisive role in the Battle of Britain.

Vehicles designed and created by the teams included futuristic-looking flying saucers, buggies and mini-helicopters and all were set the task of identifying a range of 'threats' planted in the village, such as marksmen, vehicles mounted with heavy weapons, roadside bombs and armed militia.

The winner was Team Stellar with their entry, 'Saturn', an integrated system comprising one high flying and one mini UAV (Unmanned Aerial Vehicle), and a UGV (Unmanned Ground Vehicle) able to relay information from visual, thermal and radar sensors to a control station on the ground, using sophisticated communications systems.

"I am extremely pleased", said Stellar Team Leader Julia Richardson. "We are thrilled, we worked very hard and it is a fantastic result."

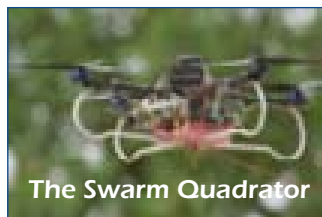
In addition, Team Swarm was awarded the prize for the "most innovative idea" after designing a multiple autonomous quadrator (flat helicopter with four rotors) called Owls, capable of flying in swarms, allowing them to view the area from all angles using high resolution visual cameras. Also, Team Thales was awarded a prize for "best use of national talent" for their use of a mini helicopter fitted with daylight and thermal imaging technology alongside two custom built ground vehicles.

The MoD will now carefully consider whether the technologies demonstrated in the final of Grand Challenge are able to be incorporated into future frontline kit for the Armed Forces.



Cycling for Heroes !

A team of 7 cyclists from The King's Royal Hussars have cycled the 877 miles from Land's End to John O'Groats in just 5½ days. Each team member cycled the full distance, (not in a relay), and the average leg length of 146 miles per day was further than the longest leg of this year's Tour de France, whilst on day 4 the team cycled 175 miles.

The team of Capt Angus Tilney, Capt Mark Brightwell, WO2 'Frenchie' Childes, Sgt Jeff MacParland, Sgt Ian Smith, Tpr Jamie Blay and Tpr Max McBride, were supported along the route and made overnight stops in campsites. 6 members of the team completed the challenge; Sgt Jeff MacParland was forced to retire after a high speed crash landed him in Exeter hospital for a night. Otherwise the team battled through severe aches and pains, scaling the undulating topography and often cycling into fierce headwinds to arrive at John O'Groats 132 hours after they had started. To date, the team have raised over £4000 for Help for Heroes.
